On the super, sunny, summer morning of July 2nd I met up with Uncle Albert, Don Pedro & 'Er in Doors, Bagpuss & Bluestreak in Derby (with the Peregrines screeching and circling overhead) and awaited the minibus to take us to Bridgnorth & Telford. Various other RuRADians such as Charisma, Didler, Bald Eagle, Wreckage and Sponge Bob were on the bus, which arrived a few minutes late though it didn't help that we were waiting for it in the wrong place, but we set off at

about 10.30. We arrived at our first port of call, the **GBG White Hart** at **Shifnall** at 11.45 (we'd have been even earlier had we not missed the turn) and were let in early to find Enville Ale & Saaz, Wye Valley HPA, Salopian Shropshire Gold & Oracle, Holdens Mild and most surprisingly Jaipur at (even more surprisingly) a very reasonable £2.80 (see, it doesn't need to be overpriced!). Were it not for the sudden in-rush of customers I would never have believed they could get so many barmaids behind that bar! Next it was on to **Bridgnorth** where we parked up at the Severn Valley Railway and split up into several groups. Our first stop was the **George**, which had Hobson's Town Crier, Brakspear Gold and Cocker Hoop. Then it was on to High Town, so called for good reason, where we bumped into Don Pedro & 'Er in Doors in the **White Lion**. Here there was St Austell Tribute, Ma Pardoe's Black Swan, Banks' Bitter, Ludlow Gold, Purity Mad Goose and Hobson's Best, oh and some home made scotch eggs. The **Golden Lion** was next on the agenda, Uncle Albert, Bagpuss & I lost most of the others on the way, and we had a choice from Hobson's Town Crier & Old Comrade, Wye Valley HPA, Salopian Golden Thread.....oh, and GK IPA. Just round the corner was the next stop the **Kings Head** where there were 10 beers split between the Stable Bar (yes, we were relieved it wasn't going to fall down) outside and the bar in the pub. The Stable Bar had the much better selection with Holden's Best & Golden Glow, Wye Valley HPA & Butty Bach and Hobson's Twisted Spire whilst inside there was Hobson's Town Crier, Derby Triple Hop and 2 from the spurious Westgate Brewery. Much amusement was taken from Bagpuss' Twisted Spire, which appeared to have been served in a specimen jar! Our penultimate stop in Bridgnorth was the **Railwayman's Arms** on the station, which due to a 1940's event was absolutely rammed but at least the queue for the bar was relatively fast moving. Hobson's Bitter, Town Crier, Mild & Old Comrade, Batham's Bitter, Sadler's Samurai, Cottage Mallard IPA and Hop Back Summer Lightning were available in plastic glasses (is there such a thing? Shouldn't it just be plastics?). We all boarded the bus, which took us to the **Hare & Hounds**, which had been shut when Didler walked down to it earlier (saving some of us a similar futile trek) to find Hobson's Town Crier, Mild & Old Comrade and Enville Ale but not enough cobs to go round. Next it was on to the **All Nations** at **Madeley**, a pub I was particularly looking forward to and I wasn't disappointed with Shires Dabley Ale, Coalport Mild & Dabley Gold and Gertie Sweet British Maid on the bar. More time taken here understandably. Oakengates was the next port of call with 3 good real ale pubs within 29 yards of one another, the **Crown Inn** had Northumberland Summer Gold, Burton Bridge Mystery Mild, Mighty Oak Maldon Gold, Spitting Feathers Solstice, Goffs White Knight, Purple Moose Dark Side of the Moose and the landlord also put on a Boggart beer on though I forget which. Just up the road is the **Old Fighting Cocks**, a Project William pub in conjunction with Ironbridge Brewery, with 4 of their brews, Citra, Foundry Gold, American Pale & Centennial alongside Three Tuns XXX and, of

course, Tiger. The **Station Hotel** had Shires Severn Gorgeous, Shropshire Pride & Ginger Cob, Salopian Shropshire Gold, Ansell's Mild, Sadler's Samurai and Salamander Golden Oldie. The local fast food outlets were summarily descended upon before boarding the minibus for our final stop, which was the **Codsall Station** at Codsall. Unfortunately by this time the day had caught up with me and I forgot to take notes/pictures to remind me of the beer selection. It was good though.....I think - Ed

Living just up the road from the **Blue Bell** in **South Wingfield**, I thought it high time to wander down to the Low Field for an evening. And what a pleasant evening it turned out to be. The 'Bell recently acquired by Steve Seaman of ASD Wholesale Ltd of Huthwaite, has undergone a massive transformation from a 'by the wayside' Pub to a Mecca for Real Ale. On show were Landlord, Bass & London Pride at £2.60 - £2.95. A 4.0% Steam On at £1.90!! And The Star of India IPA 4.6% and £2.60 was available on gravity from the Cellar. The latter 2 are brewed specially for the Blue Bell. The last 3 were sampled throughout the evening and were in top condition. Landlord and Bass proving very popular with the locals with the latter being 'top of the pots'. The Pub will undergo a major re-furb into a no-nonsense good old fashioned Boozer in the New Year which will involve an extension, a new 8-handpull bar, small kitchen and B&B upstairs. More tantalisingly, he is hosting a Beer Festival 26th to 29th August. Currently the Blue Bell opens at 4pm through the week and 1200 noon Saturday and Sunday. If you're visiting by Bus, there are stops right outside the Pub and is currently served by the Matlock-Alfreton 140. The Belper-Alfreton 142 and the Clay Cross-Alfreton-Matlock 150 services do not pass the Pub so you'll need to de-bus in South Wingfield Market Place and walk 200 yards down Hill. Check before you travel! And of course, it's only a short walk from the Bell through the old Colliery yard and you're at the **Anchor** at **Oakerthorpe** - a total of 10 Real Ales! South Wingfield has almost been a Real Ale desert in the last 6-7 years but this acquisition has been well received by Visitors and Villagers alike. The introduction of a 3 x 1/3 pint taster board with nibbles (as seen in other well known outlets) will be on offer soon to tempt the 'non-believers' into trying Real Ale. See you in there - Wheatcroft Wanderer

The 1st weekend of July was hot, real beer drinking weather. Just as well coz The Pods & family went camping at Darley Dale, where the Belper Exile Fest was held this year. There was fantastic bands and good ales flowing, courtesy of the **Barley Mow** from **Bonsall** 12 ales and 4 ciders all in excellent condition, excellent for a tent in hot weather. Our favourites being Oakhams Citra, 4.2% & Castle Rocks, Screech Owl 5.5% which layed out 2 of my brothers far too early! They just about got back to their tents. The bands were all great, headliners were: Seven Little Sisters, The Balkan Bandits, a colourful, crazy, "dance band," and The Loscoe State Opera. They had an open mic stage in the bar tent, well supported by our beer infused revellers. Derby's summer beer festival was as usual a huge success. New and old ales were all in excellent condition. We were disappointed to find that some ale's had been held back. Not quite sure why under 26 year olds got in free, whilst bus pass holders had to pay. Come on now get a grip. OK I get that we always need new CAMRA members, but did more people sign up that weekend? Or was it a case of twitter working well, and they all had a jolly nice free social band night. I did however hear a customer ask, if he joined tonight would he get his entrance money back "sorry no" was his answer. Now that's poor P.R. Aside from this moan we had a great time, our best finds came from the Liverpool Organics Best Bitter, 4.2% this was top draw. Fyne had Fiddlers Gold on, 4.5% full of American hops, yummy! The Whim and Marble collaboration produced a very fine Utopia, 5.1 (a worthy name) says it all. Summer wine, from Holmfirth, treated us to Nerotype Black IPA - Herkules 6.0 % very Moorish. Moving on to **Belper** Food, Real Ale and Craft Festival Sunday, 17th July a great way to spend a Sunday afternoon, many stalls all along the streets and in the market place and park, Music around every corner, and wonderful foods, ready to eat, or take away. What a perfect way to saunter around

sampling various ales like Amber Ales, thank you very much, then at rain time, what else could you do but shelter in the comfort of the **Cross Keys** on the last day of their beer festival, were a very nice Brampton's, Golden Bud 3.8 was well received at a really good price. We had Blue Monkey BG Sips 4% at the **Black Swan** as it was a bun fight to get indoors we moved on - 2 P's in a Pod

On the 13th of July I took my wife to the **Dolphin** beer festival in **Derby**, with a selection of forty beers to try I started on the Liverpool One's Three Graces 4.2, quickly followed by Hammerpot IPA and Angus Ales Mashie Niblick, my good lady's choice was Chuffin Ale, followed by Quadhop and Proper Job, my wife's selection was better than mine, she picks beer better than she picks blokes! We met two fellow RuRADians while we were there Trigger and Old Mother Recap, and after exchanging a few pleasantries we made our way to look at the **Old Silk Mill** after sharing a Tabatha the Knackered from Anglo Dutch, the only other beer I wanted to try from Tring was the Death and Glory 7.2%, I found out later that Rapture from Leadmill was the first beer to sell out at this festival and had to be quickly replaced - Charisma

I went to The **Cross Keys** at **Belper** on Saturday the 16th but was disappointed to find out that the **Black Swan** beer festival didn't start till Sunday. At the Cross Keys there were 9 beers in the outside bar with Laura Rose from Wirksworth brewery the 1st to sell out. Also on was Sunbeam from Wirksworth, Village Idiot from White Horse (which was renamed Belper Idiot), Golden Bud- Brampton, Simian Summer-Blue Monkey, Black Hole Bitter and three beers from Tap House, which were Malt Teaser, Kingdom Victory and Tap House Gold. I samples the Kingdom Victory and the Laura Rose, both were on excellent from, and I had to finish off with the Axe Edge from Buxton, a 6% plus double IPA- really good. Well done to John and his staff for putting on a nice little festival, I think he made the right move having the festival outside in the store room, the beer temperature was just right - Charisma
