We in RuRAD like to report on country pubs that are really "In the Sticks" and the **Black Cow in Dalbury Lees** is defiantly one of them. Lees, which is close to Radbourne saw it's only pub close after the previous landlord retired after 12 years of running the pub. Brothers Sean & Mark Goodwin, who run Talbot Farm Landscapes in Hilton purchased The Black Cow at auction and plan to run it as a traditional English pub with good beer and food. The first 3 weeks of the year has been spent giving the pub a makeover and it opened its doors again to the public on Saturday 22nd January. I went to check it out on the opening night as did most of the locals, as it was very busy. It has been tastefully decorated complimented with a mixture of wooden tables and seating, whilst retaining the open fires in the front and back rooms. Marston's have done the cellar work for them so there beers were featured on the bar, I tried Ashes Ale 4.1% at £2.65, which was very drinkable also there was Pedigree 4.5% at £2.80 & Jennings Cocker Hoop 4.6% at £2.85. I am led to believe that the plan is to have guest beers from local micros in the future as the Black Cow is a free house. The pub is open 12-3 / 5-11 Mon-Fri 12-11 Sat & Sun, food is served 12-230 & 5-9 but not Sunday evening or Monday

Del & Rod's Real Ale Rambles

Sunday 15th of January saw Del & I venture into Nottinghamshire yet again, even after last weeks debacle, parking up at Hoveringham. We walked down the Trent Valley Way, which to my relief wasn't flooded, pausing briefly at a memorial to the crews of 2 Lancaster Bombers that crashed there. We paused for a coffee at Hazelford Ferry where we were joined by a very friendly Robin for biscuits & bread. We continued along the river arriving at Fiskerton where we called in the **Bromley Arms** and had a choice from GK IPA, OSH & Abbot and Brewdog Alpha Dog, with Del going for the former and I the latter and both were in good order. More beers in the first pub than we had all day last week! A nice pub but not very busy, only one couple dining...mind it was early. From there we moved on to the neighbouring village of **Morton** and visited the **Full Moon Inn** to find another goodly choice of ale. Del and I both went for the house beer Moonshine brewed by Blue Monkey other beers on offer where Bass, GK IPA and Rudgate Battleaxe & Jorvic. A bustling pub, well worth a visit. As we continued on our way the drizzle began to creep in but we managed to get to **Bleasby** and the **GBG Waggon & Horses** still relatively dry. We were greeted by yet another array of real ales with Nottingham Rock Bitter & Mild, Blue Monkey Original, Oldershaws Holly Daze and Brewsters Hop a

Doodle Do. The Nottingham brews being sampled and in good order, a great little locals pub. I had to admit defeat and put on my waterproofs as the drizzle got more persistent. We got to **Thurgarton** and called in the **Coach and Horses** to favour Bombardier over Deuchars IPA not much of a choice but still better than last week. We were 2 of 5 people in the pub, a big pub at that. Departing I noticed another pub, the Red Lion, just up the road...probably the better pub in the village. The drizzle eased off til we got to Thurgarton Station where we sheltered for some snap, but the last mile of the walk really put the dampeners on the day.....quite literally, we got soaked

Ian is from Derby and used to run the Windmill at Breadsall and Hedio is from Belper. They are very enthusiastic about the pub and have started serving food with Thursday being grill night offering steak & chips for £4.95 and Friday being fish night and Sunday lunches being served from 12 - 4 at £5.95. There was Kimberley Bitter, OSH on the bar when I popped in with Abbot waiting to go on. Future plans include a launch weekend on February 4th, which will include several guest ales, a hog roast and live music on the Friday. They would also like to do a selection of quality wines and are also looking at the possibility of a cabaret night once a month, depending on how things go. This can only be good for the area, good luck to them - Charisma

On Friday 14th an early evening visit to the **Markeaton** at **Allestree** saw the guest beers being Copper Dragon Challenger IPA & Worthington White Shield, a couple of the former went down well after rejecting the initial offering. Later that evening I was driven to the **Risley Park** at **Risley** to see a band & ordered a pint & a half of Castle Rock Harvest Pale which came to an alarming £4-79 but was nevertheless quite acceptable, I later tried the Brains Rev James but have tasted better, Pedigree was also available. On Saturday 15th the **Greyhound** at **Cromford** had Speckled Hen, GK IPA & Abbot, the latter being reasonable. The most disturbing sight was of Crispy Duck being available on the menu so I kept well clear of the kitchen area. I was pleased to sample a Dancing Duck beer for the 2nd time on 22nd Jan, this time an Ay Up at

the **Harrington Arms, Thulston**. I was again very impressed; the other beers available were Flipside Flipping Best, Earl's Ale and Bass - Chris P Duck

With such a long hard winter, and a little time to spare, the 2 pods decided to celebrate in the traditional way and go wassailing around the local hostelrys. We wish you all a jolly 2011 especially the clever imaginative brewers country wide. We sampled Dunham Ales Milk Stout 4% Greenfield - Rudolph's Tipple 5%, Marble Pint 3.9%, Boggart Rum Porter 4.6%, Leydon Pilgrim IPA 4%, Bank Top Port O Call 5%, Pictish Winter Solstice 4.7%, Millstone 3 Shires bitter 4%, and Hornbeams Scarlet Ribbon 4% at the RuRAD Bar in the **Old Oak Inn, Horsley Woodhouse** and this was before the wonderful beer festival on December 27th who would have ever thought it would have been such a huge success between the two great holiday weekends but it was a sell-out, great atmosphere, Ales, service, and music, well done to you all. The beers that stood out 4 us were Bottle Brook Darkness on the edge of town 6.5%, Penzance Frostbite 6%, Raw Grey Ghost 5.9%, Titanic Maple Wreckage 7.2%, big numbers with big tastes to match. It was nice to see Chris and Sues 3 Cats Cider once again, with (in our opinion) their finest years production of their local cider. Moving down the road to the **Hunters Arms, Kilburn**; and what a lovely clean well kept house with a warm welcome as always from the landlord, who as ever, pays attention to detail, and has a varied selection of 5 to 6 ales in excellent condition. It is amazing to see what a change has been made to this traditional local Derbyshire Pub, keep up the good selections from Steel city, Thornbridge, Blue Monkey, Abbeydale, and Oakham brewery's, to name a few. Never had a bad one yet - 2 P's in a Pod

After receiving a text message from Didler I went up to the **Queens Head at Watnall** to pay a visit to their beer festival on Thursday 13th of January. 8 beers were in the marquee at the rear of the pub with a selection of ciders and parries. After beer tokens were purchased I sampled Leeds Pale 3.8%, and Green Jack Ole Cock 4.4% with other beers included Ossett Big Red, Exmoor Gold, Castle Rock Screech Owl, Hollands Double Dutch and Abbeydale Deception-Charisma

On Saturday 22nd January, yes the day Derby entertained Notts Forest at Pride Park, Lol (co-owner of the Smithfield) and I decided to get out of Derby for an afternoons imbibing so we jumped on the next Trent Indigo and set off for **Beeston**. The real ale scene here has improved 100% in the last 2 years and is well worth a visit. The first port of call was the **Hop Pole**, the bus stops right outside so not too far to walk. Lol went for the Castle Rock Harvest Pale 4.1% and I sampled the Nottingham EPA 4.2% with both beers being in good condition, also on the bar was Black Sheep Bitter 3.8% and Youngs Special 4.5%, beers from the Reality Brewery can be found here but due to them having moved to new premises recently not on this occasion. Next we went to the **Last Post** which is a Wetherspoons house, here they have 15 hand pumps offering a wide range of guest beers as well as the regulars, my choice was Springhead Roaring Meg 5.5%, which lacked the hoppy citrus flavour and aroma that it used to have (why do brewers have to change successful recipes?) whilst Lol went for the Harviestoun Haggis Hunter 4.1%, which he was suitably impressed with. Just around the corner was our favourite pub and East Midlands pub of the year 2010 the **Crown**, here you will find an array of guest ales to compliment the house beers Cad 4% & Bounder 3.8% both brewed by Ed at Leatherbritches, we both went for the Bounder a pale hoppy session beer which went down well with the cobs and porkpie we decided to purchase (it's hard work but some one has to do it). Our last pub to visit in Beeston was the **Victoria Hotel** close to the station which is about a 10 min walk down Dovecote Lane, as it happened there winter beer festival was in progress which gave us around 30 beers to chose from, as this pub is a big locale supporter half of the ales available were from local breweries.
