Beer and Pub News

Richard & Sue Wooley are taking on the tenancy of the **Sun Inn** at **Gotham** on July 18th, Richard informed us "We are working hard with Everards to make it into a real ale and real cider haven along with good honest homemade pub grub. I will try and introduce as many Locale and guest beers as I can on the bar as well as Everards core selection of cask ales (I have 10 hand pumps to play with, although some beers will be duplicated in both bars until we are hopefully well established). I hope to see you and other familiar faces coming in to sample a few jars"

Derby Brewing Co have teamed up with Everards Brewery in a £400,000 project to restore the **Queens Head** at **Little Eaton**, which has been closed for the last couple of months

Horsley Lodge is currently selling a micro brewery beer as well as Bass and Pedigree with Derventio being seen recently

Old Kings Head, Belper - re-opened on 14th June after a couple of weeks closed for refurb by Marston's. Now has 6 handpumps with only 3 seen in use. All beer from Marston's lists at the moment. Pedi £2.75 pint, Marston's EPA 4.2% £2.60pint - not bad at all

The **Queens Head**, Breach Road, **Marlpool**, Heanor has recently won the CAMRA East Midlands Cider pub of the year. Stef, the landlord is suitably pleased with this award (it's the 3rd CAMRA award that he's had in 3 months) and wants to make it a big event. He's laying on a free hog roast/bbq, there will also be limited free samples of cider and perry. This presentation will take place on Friday 15th July at around 8pm. The pub is also having a cider & perry tasting event on Saturday 3rd September at 2pm. There will be at least 15 ciders and 5 perrys to taste, food and 2 guest speakers. Tickets are available from Stephen P Boa, 47 Albany Street, Ilkeston, Derbyshire. DE7 5AD and cost £7.00. This entitles you to 7 x 1/3 of cider of perry

Eagle Tavern, Heage - Steve/Fred is hoping to hold his 1st Music & Beer festival weekend of 22-23rd July with beers on bar and upstairs

Black Swan at **Belper** will be holding a beer festival on 17th July to coincide with Belper Food Festival - Hog roast and cask "bright" beers on Market Place all day Sunday

Sue and Chris Rogers, the 3 Cats Cider makers, are having a cider day at 3pm on the 24th of July at the their home at Brackley Gate, Morley. This will be by ticket only at £6 each, available at the RuRAD Bar Horsley Woodhouse. There will be a selection of 3 to 4 ciders and perrys with food also provided

Mr. Angry reports there have been a few changes in and around Ripley with the **Marquis of Armond**, **Gate Inn**, **Victors**, the **Angel**, the **Kestrel** and **3 Bar** all for sale. There are new licensees at the **Barnes Wallace** and **Holybush**, **Marehay**, meanwhile at **Shirland** the **Woolpack** is also up for sale and the lease is to let at the **Hay**. Several pubs have reduced the price of a pint in Ripley which include the **Thorn Tree** and the **Pear Tree**

The **Park** at **Belper** is rumoured to have been bought by a local businessman who initially wanted to turn the pub into a dwelling, but recent updates suggest a tenant is now being sought for the pub

Nicky at the **Tavern**, **Belper** informs us "We are now selling London Pride on a regular basis at £2.90 a pint. We are selling tickets at The Tavern for the Tom Magonigal fund, for July the 16th, which are £10 each, all proceeds go to under privileged children"

Del & Rod's Real Ale Rambles

Our first and only walk in June (what with one thing and your mother) came on the gloriously sunny day of Sunday 26th. We started at the car park at Bramcote Hills and immediately set off on the Robin Hood Way over Stapleford Hill. We continued on to Strelley but were too early for a pub stop so continued on our way crossing over the M1 and heading to **Kimberley**. Now I wasn't sure where abouts the pubs were we were after but as luck would have it we came out dead opposite the first, the **GBG Stag Inn**, which had Adnams Bitter, Copper Dragon Golden Pippin, Pedi, Landlord and O'Hanlons Dragon Ale with both of us going for the latter and very well received it was too! A little further down the road we came to the **GBG Nelson & Railway**, once a fine Kimberley Ales house.....now, sadly, **Greene King** of course. Here we had a choice from **GK H&H Bitter**, **St Edmunds** (though it was on the board as "Westgate St Edmunds") **Everards Sun Chaser**, **Hydes 1863**. The latter was sampled and found to be quite insipid. We moved on, marvelling at some most unusual cloud formations, down the road to **Awsorth** and called in on of Charisma's favourite pubs, the **Gate Inn**. Here we had a couple of pints of the lowest gravity beer they had, which turned out to be **Blue Monkey Original**, which was well received as was the nice breeze

blowing down the corridor!.....so much so that I forgot to make a note of the beers. There were offerings from **Burton Bridge**, **Kelham Island**, **Batemans** and **Woodland**.....I think. We could both understand why **Charisma** thinks so highly of the place, but it is one you have to seek. We made our way back via **Cossell** and **Trowel** and were well and truly beat, luckily we didn't have far to go home

After deciding to have another weekend away we (wife & I) agreed on **Ipswich**. After a long drive we arrived late afternoon and found our guesthouse. Later we walked along the newly developed waterfront area and popped in to the **Lord Nelson**. An Adnams pub, the beer was dispensed by gravity from 5 casks lined up behind the bar. Adnams Bitter x2, Broadside, Explorer and Mild were available. Both the Bitter & Broadside were sampled and found to be in good nick. In the evening I fulfilled a long-standing wish to visit the **Dove Street Inn**. A **GBG** fixture this place is a magnet for Real Ale lovers. The front bar had about a dozen handpumps and another 6 ales along with 3 ciders were dispensed by gravity from casks in the small area behind the bar. Very popular with the locals it served a satisfying mix of national and local ales. I sampled **Grainstore Phipps IPA 4.2%**, **Maldon The Hotel Porter 4.4%**, **Humpty Dumpty Nord Atlantic 3.7%**, **Ramsbury Sun Splash 4%**, **Loddon Forbury Lion IPA 5.5%** while the wife enjoyed **Woodfordes Wherry 3.8%**. Great stuff. Be warned that the last entry is 10.45pm although the pub is open till midnight. Next it was a long (ish) walk up Spring Road to the **Fat Cat**. Not a handpump in sight, just a few blackboards listing 15 ales available from the Tap Room visible through the back of the bar. All served by gravity and delivered by hard working bar staff. Again the pub was very popular and the large outdoor seating area was crowded. I sampled a couple from the **Ipswich based cliff Quay Brewery**, **Clipper Pale Ale 4.3%** and **Sir Roger Porter 4.2%** and **St Peters Mild 3.7%**. The next morning we drove up the coast to the **Ship Inn** in **Dunwich** where we had booked for two nights. The village is pretty remote but the pub benefits from being on the **Suffolk Coastal Path** and attracted a healthy number of walkers at lunchtime and early evening. The bar offered **Humpty Dumpty Golden Gorse 5.4%** and **Green Jack Canary pale 3.8%**, which were both excellent as well as **Adnams Bitter** and **Broadside**. By now the wife had developed a serious taste for the

Broadside !! On the Sunday morning we made the short drive to **Southwold**. This is an attractive seaside resort with a pier, beach, beach huts and a brewery (Adnams) slap bang in the middle. The beer choice was monopolised by Adnams. In the **Crown Hotel** I had Lighthouse 3.4% and further down the road the **Lord Nelson** offered Ghost Ship 4.5% at a pricey £3.50. By late afternoon the weather turned foul so it was back to the Ship Inn to find that Green Jack Summer Dream 4.0% had appeared. All in all an enjoyable weekend with a good selection of top quality ale. **Marvellous!!! - Trainman**

Coppice Side, Crusader - Milestone, 9/10ths below from Titanic and Flipside Best. I tried the Brandy Snap and 9/10ths below before leaving the busy pub, very impressed with everyone's efforts to keep the festival ticking along - Charisma

On Friday 17th I met up with Trigger & Old Mother Redcap in the **Brunswick, Derby** before catching the bus out to the **Portland Hotel** beer festival. We were slightly dismayed as we thought the 5 beers on the bar were all that was on offer but we were directed to the stillage outside. The "LocAle Bar" featured 8 beers from the likes of Blue Monkey, Burton Bridge, Nutbrook, Tower, Mr. Grundy's, Dancing Duck and, to my delight, Wentwell. All beers sampled were in fine form. Trigger and I headed back in to town calling in the **Crown & Cushion** where there were 3 beers from the Marston's range. From there Trigger had a revelation "Lets try the **Beaconsfield**, it's in the Derby Drinker". So we did. Pedigree and a house beer were on offer, we went for the house beer, which was rather nice and rather cheap. The owner, a very affable fellow, came over and had a chat with us about beer and the like and when we left, we did so glad we'd visited - Ed

Saturday 18th of June I dropped into the **George and Dragon** at **Belper** where I found nearly half of the 20 beers had already gone including Hop Back - Summer Lightening, Dancing Duck - Gold, Brains - S.A. Gold, Black Hole - Red Dwarf, Ashover - Rainbows End, Abbeydale - Moonshine and Nailers - Old Gold, I had to settle for Wirksworth Snow Field and Daleside Nightjar, should have been there earlier other beers included Jennings, Everards, Wadworths, Wells, Wychwoods, Tower, Flipside, St Peters, Harviestoun, Ringwood and Marston's, Old Empire with 4 ciders and 1 perry available. Everything sold-out that night a sign things had gone well - Charisma

RuRAD Supporting Local Beer Festivals

On Friday 10th I met up with Trigger and Old Mother Redcap in the **Exeter Arms, Derby** (which has improved considerably since being taken over, in your editors humble opinion anyway) where we were later joined by Chris P Duck who was too late to get a drink. After a brief stop off in the Brewery Tap, where we parted company with OMR, the 3 of us headed to the beer festival at the **Horse & Groom**. The festival beers were set up on a stillage in the garage, which was getting rather hot until the door was pulled up. There were 11 beers set up on the stillage and I sampled Country Life Pot wallop, Tap House Dark & Dangerous and Leatherbritches Dovedale & Lemongrass & Ginger. I was going to try the Blue Ball too but Sooty didn't recommend it. As the room was starting to fill up and the rain had stopped we decided to move on and visit the **Old Silk Mill, Dolphin** and some of the less salubrious pubs in town as part on mine & CPD's challenge to visit all the pubs within the Derby City boundary in 2011. The **Slug & Lettuce**, the **Old Bell**, **Shakespeare's** and **Jorrocks** all had real ale, to their credit, which is more than can be said for some pubs we've been in - Ed

On Saturday May 28th after learning the tent outside the **White Post** at **Stanley Common** had blown away again, the outside bar had been relocated inside the pub and they had done a fantastic job to get everything running again. On the main bar there was Robin Hood bitter - Springhead, Game Keeper - Milestone, Coppice mild, Coppice Side and house beer Winning post - Funfair, on the festival bar The Parish Farm gold and Brandy Snap Funfair was selling well, also on this bar was Leveller - Spring Head, Deception -

On Sunday I visited the **Greyhound** beer festival at **Belper** and was pleased to meet Trev, Paul and Maria Gibson, all camera members. The Proper Job had already sold out and I think most of the other beers where getting low. I sampled the Clarks Rams Revenge and Fool Gold from North Yorkshire, other beers on offer were from Blue Monkey, Brewsters, Burton Bridge, Elgoods, Dales Side, Idle, Peak, Skinners, St Austell's, Sharps and RCH. There was also a range of Greene King beers including Abbot, IPA and Speckled Hen on the main bar not forgetting the ciders and perrys. All in all a very successful beer festival according to the landlord, so well he's thinking of putting on another soon - Charisma

Friday 24th I ZigZagged to **Ilkeston** and visited the **Spanish Bar** beer festival. I immediately bumped in to Didler who was so excited about the Bridgnorth & Telford trip he thought it was on the following day (there will no doubt be a report next month). Whilst perusing the offerings Uncle Albert turned up just in time to buy the beer. There were 20 beers outside plus the usual 4 on the bar inside, I never got to see what they were though, it was too busy. I tried Salamander Screw Ball, Elgoods Raging Bull, Hopping mad Fruit Case, Salopian Aztec, Bradfield Farmers Stout, Abbeydale Original Sin, Raw Maximus Debate & Muirhouse Stumbling About and all were in top nick. Other beers available were from the likes of Castle Rock, Kelham Island, Whim, Blue Monkey, Buxton, Dancing Duck and Bottle Brook. We were later joined by Steady Steve who kindly gave me a lift home - Ed
