Beer and Pub News

Mark at the **Hunters Arms, Kilburn** informs us that the pub now has 5 hand pumps featuring the likes of Leatherbritches, Blue Monkey, Marston's & Oakham plus Weston's Scrumpy all at £2.60 a pint plus a 20p discount for card carrying CAMRA members

The **Mallard, Worksop** will be holding a Summer Beer Festival Friday 30th - Saturday 31st July. Open 11 am daily

The **Tavern at Belper** will be open for the World Cup all day every day from start to finish. Opening at 12pm until 11pm Monday to Thursday, Friday and Saturday its 12pm - 12am and Sunday 12pm - 10:30 pm. Also the sun terrace has the sun in the height of summer until it goes down, also the next beer festival will be on August bank holiday weekend (27th - 30th). Children and dogs are very welcome

The annual Thornbridge Charity Garden Party will take place at Thornbridge Hall, Ashford-in-the-Water on Sunday 4th July this year, and will see the launch of a brand new beer on the brewery bar

There is to be a mini beer festival 18th to 20th June at the **Bell Inn** Cromford Hill **Cromford** in conjunction with the "Celebrate Cromford" weekend

The **White Post at Stanley Common** is now free of tie and plan to have a charity event in aid of MS on July 17th, which will include a larger range of beers. They are also offering a 20p a pint discount to card carrying CAMRA members, not 10p as stated in last months newsletter. Unfortunately there will only be one beer festival this year though and it will be August bank holiday weekend

The Amber Valley CAMRA beer festival has been confirmed for Sept 30th to Oct 3rd at the Midland Railway Centre at Ripley

Andy McAuley at Marlpool Brewery had hoped to be brewing by early May though it now seems more likely that a test brew will be completed by the end of the month. On a recent visit the brewery vessels were in-situ and being wired and tested and the liquor tank was being put in place. Dave Tizard of Fun Fair Brewery is lending a hand installing the kit, which was at one time used at the Wheel at Holbrook, and will help Andy with the test brew

Sue & Chris Rogers, the Three Cats Cider people, are planning to have a social event on Sunday July 18th from 3pm til 7pm at Morley. There will be a cider making demonstration plus sampling of course and nibbles will be provided. Admittance is strictly by ticket only, available at the RuRAD Bar

Friday 7th May saw the launch of 'Anchor Ale' from Wirksworth Brewery, this 4% session beer has been brewed especially for the **Hope & Anchor** in **Wirksworth** and is set to run alongside St Austell Tribute as a house beer. Jeff Green has been pleased with the feedback from the local drinkers and has also commented on how supportive the **Hope & Anchor** have been ever since he first started brewing 2 ½ years ago

The Sir Barnes Wallis (formerly The Woodman) is a joint venture with Everards Brewery of Leicester under the Project William scheme, and joins the **Talbot Taphouse**, also in Ripley, as a regular outlet for Amber Ales in the local area

After a very long search for the right pub Dave Tizard and partner Abigail have found one that ticks all the right boxes. The pub is the **Chequers** in the village of **Elston** near Newark, which they plan to open on June 4th. No doubt there will be a lot of hard work put into this venture to make this freehouse the place to visit. There are plans to have 6 hand pumps and 2 ciders through wooden casks, with the feature of the pub being a giant psychedelic teapot selling Fun Fairs well known and popular Tea Cups Ginger Beer. Future plans could see Fun Fair Brewery moving to the premises as there is ample room to accommodate it - Charisma

On Thursday 20th May Derby Brewing Company's second pub the **Greyhound** in Friargate **Derby** reopened following a £400,000 refurbishment, the pub has been closed for the past 4 years but after an extensive refit which is of a similar style to the Brewery Tap it has been given a new lease of life. I called in on the opening night and even at 10pm the pub was extremely busy, there are 10 hand pumps on the bar and on my visit were dispensing Derby Brewing Triple Hop 4.1%, Business as Usual 4.4%, Mine Host 4.5%, Double Mash 4.6%, Penny's Porter 4.5% Old Intentional 5% Milestone Normanton IPA 4.1%, Amber Wet & Wild 3.6%, JTS Gold 4.5% and Taylors Landlord 4.3%. Prices ranged from £2.45 to £2.85 per pint, of course the beers will change almost daily if the popularity keeps up. Sooty

On passing **Mr. Grundys** on Ashbourne Road in **Derby** recently I noticed a banner advertising the fact that there is to be a micro brewery opening there soon, on further investigation I was told that the kit is on order and that they hope to be brewing by the Summer. Further information will be printed in future newsletters as always as soon as we know more - Sooty

Del & Rod's Real Ale Rambles

On the super sunny summer Sunday morning of May 23rd Del Boy & I started our walk from Kings

Bromley in Staffordshire. We got lost almost immediately, well not lost as such, a path through a pick-your-own farm had been diverted - unbeknown to us - so we bumbled in the direction indicated on the map. We made our way to Alrewas Hayes and Fradley Junction on the Trent & Mersey Canal before following the Coventry Canal to Fradley. We had a walk through the village, just to check if there was a pub, before moving on to **Alrewas** where we knew there were at least 3. We called in the **Crown** on Post Office Rd to find Bass, Pedi and Abbot available both going for the former, which was only average.....nice traditional pub though and under new management. Next we walked past the George & Dragon (having been in it before) and headed for the **William IV** on - funnily enough - William IV Rd to find Pedi and English Pale Ale, unfortunately we didn't see the latter until we'd procured the former. Still it was better than the Bass but I do think it had a lot to do with the heat of the day....that's my excuse anyway. From there we took the path along the Trent valley stopping for some snap and a kip on the way (Summer is definitely back)

Slayed and Ashover Rainbows End. I preferred the Oak Ale as it was very malty, just how I like my beer. After checking everyone was on the bus we traveled the short distance to the Burton Bridge Inn where I proceeded to get a pint spilt down me as the bar sloped and someone (who shall remain nameless) unknowingly put their glass down on it and I was standing in the wrong place at the wrong time (or it could have been the right place at the wrong time - Ed). There was only 1 beer for me here, the Festival 5.5%, which was very nice. The other beers were Golden Delicious, Bridge Bitter, Sovereign Gold, Porter and the Gold Medal Ale. After a brief photo shoot it was off to the Wetmore Whistle but we never saw Dangerous (awesome) Dave as this is one of his haunts. I can't remember what ales were on as by this time I was well oiled but Screech Owl, Harvest Pale and Pedi spring to mind. We got back to Horsley Woodhouse this time without leaving anyone behind with a pee stop or 2 on the way, a good night, which I think everyone enjoyed - Charisma

scribbled on to the back of an old envelope and I was suitably impressed. After I'd got some tokens from the bar, where there were 4 or 5 ales, I ventured upstairs to find 20 beers on a stillage plus 3 ciders/perrys. I had a chat with the landlord whilst I picked my first beer, Tom Wood's Dark Mild, and he told me that they'd been in the pub just over a year were gradually building it up as a good real ale outlet now that it is free of tie. Next I had Hadrian & Border Gladiator and the local Muir House Sprouts Mexicane Mild. I finished off with another local beer Boddalls Potible 7.4%, which was a new one on me. The beers were sourced by Full Mash Brewery (which are featured in the pub quite regularly) and included beers from the likes of Peakstones Rock, Atomic, Maypole, Headless, Oldershaws, Brewsters, Spire, Magpie, Fun Fair, Festival and of course Full Mash. For a first beer festival I was very impressed and I look forward hearing of future events - Ed

On Friday 14th I managed to pay a visit to Pete & Nicky's first beer festival at the **Tavern, Belper**, which was well supported by Trevor Harris of Derby Brewing Co who sourced the beers and supplied the cooling system and the stillage. There was a selection on the bar and 10 beers outside, which was a pleasant, cosy atmosphere (surprising what a bit of sun can do). I had Brew Co Euphoric followed by Muir House Fully Fitted Freight 4%. Most of the other beers were from local breweries including Falstaff, Brunswick, Leatherbritches, whim, Amber Ales, Bottle Brook and of course Derby. I gather from feedback from Pete & Nicky that it went really well, so much so that another is planned for August bank holiday, Mon to Fri - Horizontal Paul

On Friday April 30th I called in the **Poet & Castle** at **Codnor** to visit their beer festival where there were around 60 ales in total, most of which were on the 2 bars (but not all) not bad for a pub festival. I started with Dark Star Golden Gate 4.5% and Kelham Island Captain IPA 6%. There was also a selection of 7 Ashover ales though not all were available. The selection included beers from most parts of the country as well as local brewery beers. I would say a good mix, which included some rare and newish beers, I think what I'm trying to say is that you were spoilt for choice - Charisma
