Beer and Pub News

An amendment to the article from last months newsletter on the **Cap & Stocking** came to me it is, of course, in **Kegworth** not Castle Donington

To commemorate the landmark occasion of Olive Wilson's 55th anniversary as landlady of the **Royal Oak** at **Ockbrook** a beer festival will be held from 2nd to 5th of May. Local breweries will provide the theme with Amber Ales Imperial Pale Ale & Original Stout, Ashover Butts Pale Ale & Poets Tipple, Brampton Mild & Golden Bud, Nutbrook Or '8& Battle Bitter, Peak Ales Swift Nick & Bakewell Best, Tollgate Bitter & Red McAdy, Whim Ales Flower Power and Wirksworth T'OWd Man having already been confirmed plus Headless, Thornbridge and Holland all being well

Devonshire Arms, South Normanton, Sunday 10th February - Falstaff Phoenix 4.7%, GK Morland Old Speckled Hen 4.5% and Sarah Hughes Dark Ruby 6% - Still the premier Real Ale House in South Normanton. 2 beers from Boggart Hole Clough Brewery were delivered on Monday 11th which I look forward to trying soon. **Hawthorns, South Normanton**, Monday 11th February - NRA - Will check again soon to see if this changes. **Wagon & Horses, Alfreton**, 3 Good Guest Beers available on Saturday 9th February 2008 these were White Horse Giant 4.3%, J W Lees John Willies 4.5% and Saitaire Yorkshire Pale Bitter 3.8% coming soon was Mauldons White Adder 5.3% - Tweedle Dum

New licensees took over the **Travellers Rest** at **Kilburn** on February 18th

Belper Town Football Club will be holding a Beer Festival on Friday 23rd, Saturday 24th and Sunday 25th May 2008. Live Music on Friday and Saturday. Free Admission, 50 Real ales on sale. Opening Times Friday 5pm - 11.30pm, Saturday 12.00 - 11.30pm & Sunday 12.00 - 11.00pm

It is my sad duty to report that the **Jolly Sailor** at **Hemington** has been sold to the dreaded Greene King. Peter and Margaret Frame had been made an offer they could not refuse after 18 years at the pub. Peter, renowned for his absolute dedication to keeping a good selection of quality beers and ciders together with their friendly manner were voted Pub of the Year two years running in 2006 and 2007 by Loughborough Camra. The **Wheel** at **Holbrook** should have a new landlord by the end of March

The **Rays Arms** at **Heanor** are introducing 20p off a pint with free food and entertainment on Mondays 2 - 5pm also Bald Eagle reports that on a recent visit the beer was on excellent form with Oyster Stout, Marston Porter and a mild on at the time

After the success of the recent beer festival at the **Lion Hotel, Belper** it is hoped that more will follow with one possibly in the courtyard in the summer. From March 1st beer will be £2 a pint to card carrying CAMRA members

The **Patternmakers** at **Duffield** is proving to be an up and coming real ale pub, when I visited it they had Bass, Pedi, Landlord and Derventio Cupid with beers from Abbeylea, Kelham Island and Thornbridge arriving at the end of February with beer from Church End and Brewsters planned - Charisma

Tim Buxey is the new manger at the **Steam Packet** at **Swanwick**; on a recent visit there was Bombardier, Broadside, Blacksheep Bitter, Old Speckled Hen, London Pride and Spitfire available. Tim reports that there has been an upturn in trade and hopes to start serving food, including Sunday lunches, when the new kitchen equipment has been installed. He is also looking into having a beer festival for St Georges Day, which used to be a regular event at one time - Charisma

Colin's guest beers for March at the **Cross Keys Belper** includes Oakham White Dwarf 4.3%, Derby Light Fantastic 4.5%, Spire Whiter Shade of Pale 4%, Castle Rock Black Gold 3.5%, Mauldons Cuckoo 4.3%, Derby Triple Hop 4.1%, Peak Ales Bakewell Best Bitter 4.2%, Oldershaws Mowbray Mash 3.7%, Leeds Best Bitter 4.3% and Castle Rock Mr Toad 4.5%. The pub now has its own "House beer" brewed by Bateman's and called Golden Keys 4.2%, Colin reports that it has been selling like hot cakes in recent weeks

John & Jean at the **Anchor, Oakerthorpe** informed us that the forthcoming beers will include Anchor Special Celebration Ale, Tunnel Vision & Pullman Pint, all from Cropton Brewery of course

The **Nags Head** at **Ripley** is hoping to have a beer festival for St Georges Day of which we hope to have more details next month, also there is a wider range of real ales available at weekends

The **Denby Lodge** at **Denby** is closing for refurbishment with 2 more hand pumps being added

Jim Bradford has taken over the **Bulls Head** at **Openwoodgate** after spending a few years in and around Essex, he has moved to this area after being a relief manager in Bulwell and Kilburn and has settled at the Bulls Head. On a recent visit he had Greene King IPA, Abbot, Morland Original and Kimberley Bitter. Entertainment on Saturday night is in the form of a singer with the jamming session of folk music proving very popular. With Jims experience in food (being a chef) he hopes to start serving food after the pub has been refurbished in March - Charisma

Peter Parkes R.I.P.

The Real Ale scene in Derby lost one of its stalwarts with the death of Peter Parkes on February 8th, at the age of 76. Peter bought the **Falstaff**, on Silverhill Road, Normanton, in 1996 and, in partnership with his son Adrian, transformed it from a scruffy back street pub with a usually decent pint of Pedigree into a haven for Real Ale lovers through the introduction of an imaginative range of guest beers. A Good Beer Guide regular since Peter and Adrian took over, the Falstaff put Normanton back on the Real Ale map, particularly with the opening of the original Falstaff Brewery in 1999. Although the brewery closed in 2001, it has since been successfully revived under the stewardship of current licensees Steph Briggs and Jim Hallowes. A long-time regular at the Falstaff, Peter always had a cheerful greeting for every customer at the pub, welcoming them from his usual seat at the table nearest to the entrance to the Bar. It has been very strange in recent weeks to walk into the Falstaff and not see Peter in his usual seat. It is even more strange to think that he will never be sitting there again. With his passing, the world in general, and the Falstaff in particular, will seem a lesser place, so rest in peace Pete, you may be gone, but you will never be forgotten by those of us who were privileged to know you - Trevor Spencer

calendars, and we look forward to seeing even more people there this year." Admission £5 in advance, £6 on the gate. Advanced booking is recommended. Ticket price includes a commemorative glass. There will be a **FREE** bus service on offer between Chesterfield Railway Station (picking up outside the Comet showroom and the Derby Tap) and the Roundhouse. This Bus will run regularly throughout the event. There is also ample free parking at the Roundhouse. 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**55th Anniversary Beer
Festival 2nd to 5th May**

As reported in the last issue, confirmation comes to us that Kim and Jackie Beresford from the **Old Poets Corner** at **Ashover** have acquired the **New Clock** at **Codnor**, formerly known as the Red Admiral and the Clock, which has been closed since December. Kim advises that the pub will be renamed - readers are invited to submit ideas for the new name. The pub will offer up to 8 different cask ales, featuring those from Ashover Brewery, plus a range of guest ales, together with traditional ciders and perries, fruit wines and live music - in other words, the winning formula that has proved so successful at The Old Poets!! The pub will be operated free of any ties on cask ales under a business agreement with Everards Brewery of Leicester. A refurbishment will take place and the opening date will be advised in due course

Following on from news last month of a Strong Ales beer festival at The Waggon & Horses in Alfreton, we have been advised of a mini-beer festival to be held at the **Spa Lane Vaults** in **Chesterfield** in conjunction with Wentworth Brewery, starting on Friday 7th March and running over the weekend, offering a selection of 5 Wentworth ales, followed with a "Meet The Brewer" night on Monday 10th March at approx 7pm. CAMRA members are invited to come along to the event as it is the first mini-festival to

be held at the pub. It is hoped to make brewery feature weekends a monthly occurrence at the pub

There is a possibility that the beer festival bar at the **Old Oak Inn** at **Horsley Woodhouse** may be opening Friday, Saturday & Sunday, akin to the old Stables Bar, selling a different range of ales to the main bar. It will probably start on a trial basis, more details to follow - Charisma

Don Pedro & 'Er in Doors decided to start the year with a spot of culture. How about visiting a few churches? Yes! To cut a long car journey short we visited 5, Dethick, Ashover, Morton, Tibshelf and Shirland, 2 before lunch and 3 after all well worth the effort. In **Ashover** what else can one do but call in the **Old Poets Corner**? They had 9 beers on offer, which included Church End Vicars Ruin 4.4%, Hartington IPA 4.5%, GK Abbot 5%, Fullers ESB 5.5%, Landlord 4.3%, Thornbridge Kipling 5.2%, and 3 home brews Light Rale 3.7%, Poets Tipple 4% & Winter Warmer 7%. Just too many to try in one lunchtime, think they do B&B I wonder if Pedro could be persuaded? (I'm sure you could twist his arm-Ed)

The Wayfarer Wanderer

The 18th of January, yet another Friday with no work so I decided to do a bit of wayfaring (what a marvellous thing the Derbyshire Wayfarer ticket is). I got the 12.07 to Sheffield and alighted at **Chesterfield**, which I hardly recognised after all the work that has been done to the station (shame the same can't be said for Derby). I made my way along Saltergate and Tennyson Avenue on to Queen St and the GBG listed **Industry**, which had Acorn Northdown Blonde and Spire Dark Side of the Moon. I plumped for the Spire brew but it tasted a little close to the end of its shelf life to be enjoyable, this is a real locals pub so much so that I got the feeling I was sitting on someone's barstool....or maybe I was just imagining it! I made my way on to Sheffield Rd where I caught the No.25 Stagecoach bus (at the second attempt) to **New Whittington**, unfortunately I got off at Old Whittington and had to walk the last mile or so to the GBG **Wellington** on High St where I had a choice from Jennings Cross Buttock, Freeminer Bitter and Marstons Oyster Stout. I thought that Marston had stopped producing cask Oyster Stout so I just had to sample it but it wasn't as good as I remembered. Fortunately there was a bus waiting at the stop outside the pub so I managed to jump straight on and head back into town. Having clocked their locations on the outward trip I alighted at **Whittington Moor** and called in the GBG **Red Lion** on Sheffield Rd. This Old Mill Brewery pub had Mild, Bitter, Bullion & Black Jack I opted for the latter and it was my first decent drink of the day....and the first decent pub. A short walk (in the rain) towards town brought me to the GBG **Derby Tap**, a Tynemill pub that had Castle Rock Harvest Pale & Preservation Ale, Tiger, St Austell Proper Job, Hop Back Special, Landlord, Abbeydale Moonshine and Slaters Queen Bee. The Hop Back proved to be another good drink in another good pub. I jumped on the first bus I saw that was heading back into town and

after some directions from a couple of very friendly, if somewhat inebriated, lads I caught the No.51 Stagecoach bus to Danesmoor and got off at **Tupton** (not sure if it's Old or New) and called in the **Britannia**, Spire's brewery tap on Ward St. Here there was Spire Chesterfield Best Bitter, Land of Hop & Glory & Sgt Pepper Stout, Rudgate Ruby Mild & Special, Marston Moor Mongrel and Howard Town Glotts Hop. I sampled the Best Bitter and the Sgt Pepper Stout, which I was proudly informed won Bronze at the National Winter Ales festival...wholly deserved. This is a cracking, friendly pub well worth a visit even though it's a little off the beaten track I think the buses run every 10 minutes or so, so its not difficult to get to and like me I don't think you will be disappointed (you were right Charisma). After a short chat with the landlord, who was having a fag break, I got some sustenance from the chip shop at the top of the street before catching the No.51 back to town. I almost decided to omit the GBG **Royal Oak** on The Shambles having been in it before but I didn't and what a decision it turned out to be. Alongside Stones and Ruddles County there were 2 beers from the new Brampton Brewery Golden Bud & Impy Dark both of which I sampled and were quite acceptable, though the Impy Dark was a little thin...if you know what I mean? It was a fair old trudge to the final pub of the day, the GBG **Peacock** on Chatsworth Rd where there was Tetley, Deuchars, Broadside, Blacksheep Bitter and Peak Ales Swift Nick, which just about made the hike worthwhile. I just managed to get the 6.35 back to Derby and all that for £8.30...bargain

A visit was paid to the **Green Man** in **Ashbourne** on 23rd February to find out how the relocation of Leatherbritches Brewery was coming along, I was told that the plant was in position but they were still waiting for the utilities to be connected up so that brewing could commence. There was a good range of beers on in the bar including Cottage Wessex Red 4%, Cottage The Pawfather 4.2%, Falstaff Sarah Jane 4.4% & Castle Rock Great Crested Grebe 4.2% all beers were around the £2.60 mark and in good condition

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Del & Rods Real Ale Rambles

Just after 6.00 on the evening of Thursday 21st of February Del Boy, Uncle Albert, Stud Muffin and I set off on our annual March excursion to the lakes...a few weeks early due to this, that & the other. Thursday night runs are usually quite good and this was no exception as we arrived at our customary first port of call, the **Watermill Inn** at **Ings** at 8.45. On our last few visits the blank spaces on the beer board have seemed to be getting more abundant, which is a bit of a worry, but 3 house beers were available. On arrival in **Keswick**, after getting settled in at our digs and, to our consternation, finding that the Olde Keswickian was closed due to fire damage and the other chip shops closed at 8.00, we called in the **Dog & Gun** where there was Keswick Thirst Run, Thirst Fall & Thirst Guide, Hawkshead Bitter and Coniston Bluebird. We partook of the Keswick beers and were not disappointed but we couldn't get a seat, as it was quiz night, so we called in the **Oddfellows** because Stud Muffin (who doesn't visit the lakes very often) wanted some Jennings. Bitter, Cumberland, 1828 & Sneck Lifter were available at the usual steep prices. The following morning after a satiating breakfast we set off for, what I thought would be, an easy walk from Surprise View to bag Walla Crag, Bleaberry

Fell, High Seat, High Tove & Armboth Fell, the sodden summit ridge made it difficult enough and then there was the 85mph crosswind to cope with! Never have I had so much difficulty staying upright.....not at that time of day anyway! We had to cling to the trig point on High Seat like Limpets to prevent ending up somewhere in Thirlmere, it was so bad we cut it short by one top, so wet and windswept were we. After surviving that tribulation we called in the Riverside Bar at the GBG listed **Scafell Hotel** in **Rosthwaite** where there was Theako's Best Bitter, XB & OP, Copper Dragon Best Bitter, Heskett Newmarket Scafell Blonde and Keswick Thirst Noel 6% but more importantly there was a roaring open fire we could commandeer. I couldn't resist the Thirst Noel (I thought I'd earned it) the others were more sensible. Later that evening we were joined by Drummer Boy who had come to accompany us for my final Wainwright, this time we managed to get a seat in the Dog & Gun so there was no need to move. So came the big day, after another nourishing breakfast, we parked up at Seathwaite and headed off to Stockley Bridge and up Grains Gill. Yesterdays appalling conditions had not abated (had maybe even worsened), which forced Del Boy, Uncle Albert & Stud Muffin to beat a hasty (and sensible) retreat leaving Drummer Boy and I to forge ahead regardless. After visiting Esk Hause twice and getting half way to Great End we found Esk Hause shelter in the mist from where we got our bearings and trudged up to Esk Pike 2903ft and in doing so I completed the 214 Wainwright summits in the Lake District. Not quite the occasion I'd hoped for but big thanks to Drummer Boy without whom I think I would have had a futile return. The occasion was toasted with a couple of bottles of Jennings Redbreast before heading down, and after realising we were heading off towards Langdale we about faced and got back on the Grains Gill path. That evening we had a drive out to **Threlkeld** where we managed to get a meal in the **Salutation**, which was a bit dull on the beer front except for Heskett Newmarket Doris' 90th Birthday, which accompanied the meal superbly. We were all too tired, or ill, to venture into town so we chilled out in the B&B lounge with the complimentary sherry. Just a word of advice to any readers who are planning to complete the "Wainwrights", leave a little one for last....Castle Crag maybe?
