Beer and Pub News

The presentation of the Pub of the Year awards was (for some insane reason) made during the trade session of the Derby Winter Beer Festival on Thursday afternoon. As you are probably aware the **Silk Mill** in **Derby** was the overall winner but **Jean Hornbuckle & Sally Parrot** of the **Royal Oak** at **Ockbrook** not only collected the Country Pub of the Year but also a special award for being in the Good Beer Guide since 1976

Terry at the **Red Lion, Fritchley** plans to open his stables at the back of the pub, into a stables bar selling real ale straight from the barrel sometime at the end of March or the beginning of April, serving 4 real ales and 1 or 2 ciders. The barrels will sit in the old feeding tray the horses used to eat out of, **Charisma** reports that after being shown around by Terry it looked very rustic and very impressive and will be a place well worth a visit

The former **Cricketers** at **Kilburn** has been refurbished and reopened as the **Headmasters Office** selling **Greene King** beers, we have had reports that the real ales are selling for £3 40 a pint

The **Stumble Inn** at **Long Eaton** has received **Erewash CAMRA's** Most Improved Pub Award. This is testament to the hard work **Kerry & Martin** have put in since taking the pub on in 2009

Besides the normal **Marston's** range the newly opened **Black Cow** at **Lees** has had **Derventio Cleopatra** and the landlord has said that he also hopes to feature **Mr. Grundy's**, **Dancing Duck**, **Peakstones Rock** and other local breweries in the near future

Del & Rod's Real Ale Rambles

Our first, and only, walk in February occurred on Sunday 13th and started from the car park at Thorpe in the Peak District. No sooner had we set off and Del decided he needed to lie down in the middle of the road, after tripping down a pot-hole whilst adjusting his rucksack strap. We carried on through Fenny Bentley and made our meandering way to **Parwich** where we naturally called in the **GBG Sycamore Inn**. Robinson's Mr. Scrooge, Double Hop and (to my rapture) Old Tom were available with us both starting with Mr. Scrooge, which Del Boy stayed with being designated driver whilst I finished off with Old Tom.....just a half mind at £4.60 a pint, which isn't bad considering the Mr. Scrooge at 4.4% was £3. A super little pub this and friendly t'boot. From there we cut across on to the Tissington Trail where we got talking to a chap from Dalbeattie who must have brought some of his local weather down with him as we were well and truly wet by the time we got back

On February 18th, I travelled to stay by the sea at **Arnside** on the Lancs/Cumbria border. The **Albion** had the 4 usual Thwaites beers on the bar plus their seasonal guest. In conversation with the landlord who was from Stoke, he managed to get an occasional beer from Titanic on their guest list. Apparently the Titanic sank on my birthday and of course these beers always go down well. We were staying at another Thwaites pub, the **Fighting Cocks**, but they only had Wainwright on. After a cold Saturday at Leighton Moss, a warm pub became a necessity so we visited the **Woodlands Hotel** in **Silverdale**. A large rambling former residential hotel and recent **GBG** pub, we

entered through a palatial entrance hall into a narrow bar, to our surprise absolutely rammed with locals, kids and dogs at 4.30 in the afternoon with an enormous range type fireplace with roaring fire, which reflected in the window making it look like the car was on fire. The beer list was very interesting and all beers superb - they were Elgoods Mustang, Wyre Piddle Polar Piddle, Wharfbank Tether Blonde, Blackwater Bauhaus and Ennerdale Blonde. With these ales and loads of friendly banter with staff and locals we could have stayed for hours but driver duties curtailed this visit. It was always going to be a difficult act to follow but we caught a train to **Lancaster**, our mistake being to not check **GBG** first. On our vague ramble we entered the **Robert Gillow**, a Hyde's pub with Finest & Original consumed and very good too. Feeling a bit tongue-tied I did not try the Pheasant Plucker. There appeared to be a dearth of decent pubs and we went in the Spoons' **Sir Richard Owen** for a bite to eat with Cumberland Corby Ale and Allendale Golden Plover. Not liking the look of some less savoury establishments we went to the **Merchants 1688**, which is a trendy wine bar type place with expensive beer, on the way back to the station. In here I tried the Moorhouse Pride of Pendle witch (sorry, which) was decent enough with Deuchars IPA and Black Sheep also on. On researching **GBG** later, we had not seen any of the current listed pubs so it should have been much better. The following day a new excuse, an 11 metre tide, forced me to enter the **Commodore in Grange over Sands**. Pubs at all are at a premium at this geriatrics Victorian resort, so I was really pleased to find 3 ales available here. The Lancaster Amber was a superb 3.7% drink with plenty of flavour and the first time I have sampled this brewery with Derwent Old Cocker and Theakstons Best the others - Chris P Duck

RuRAD Supporting Local Beer Festivals

Even though we are only 2 months into the year there have been a lot of beer festivals to visit within our area. On Friday 4th February I caught the Red Arrow to Chesterfield for the Peaks and Lakes beer festival at the Winding Wheel and I must say what an excellent range of beers there were available. New brews from the peaks included Raw Edge 4.5% & Twilight Black Lager 4.8%, Spire Amarillo 5.2%, Buxton Axe Edge & Barlow Imperial Stout 8%, Highlights from the

Lakes were Dent Black Lamb Stout 4.2, Ulverston Bad Medicine 6.3%, Stringers Hop Priest 6.5% and joint Lakes beers of the festival Hardknott Coolfusion 4.4% & Hawkshead Lakeland Gold 4.4%. The Peaks beer of the festival was Ashover Hydro 4.3%. The following Friday on a wet miserable evening I visited The National Brewery Centre in Burton (formerly the Bass Museum) for there International Festival of Beer advertising over 750 beers from around the world, most of these beers were in bottles but they also had an extensive range of real ales. Beer was only served in 1/3rd measures but that meant more ales could be sampled during the evening, the highlights for me were Highland Island Hopping 3.9%, Windsor & Eaton Conqueror Black IPA 5%, Harvey's Star of Eastbourne 5.5%, Jersey Liberation Noire 4.8%, Belhaven Tantalion Sunrise 5% and White Shield Brewery Tap 4.5% served from the main bar. All in all, be it a bit disorganized, it was a good evening out with a barbeque and a hog roast also being available as well as entertainment. Derby is the next local festival (report in next issue) along with The Unicorn, Loughborough, Leicester and Burton during March (new liver please!) - Sooty

however sample Hogwood Goshen Ale, Forge Dreckley, Butts Blackguard, Liverpool Organic Johnny handsome and Elland 1872 Porter before dropping on to Coppice Side Bitter Robin & Blonde, Mr. Grundy's 1914 (which I think I just about got the last half of thanks to Steve Twells) and Amber Samuel Slater. My only real criticism of the new venue was the inadequate toilet facilities though I do hope that rumours (voiced by several) of moving the Summer festival there are unfounded.

I had to pass on an offer for a visit to the trade session, as I couldn't get the time of work, which was a shame. My first visit was the evening session on Thursday 24th and I was suitably impressed with the venue. At last some atmosphere at the winter festival. Del & I met up with Don Pedro, 'Er in Doors, Uncle Albert & Sea Bass and immediately familiarized ourselves with the new set up. With several unusual breweries to go at I started off with Leyden Nanny Flyer before trying Penpont St Nonna's and bumping into Charisma (almost literally as he'd been there since 2pm). With work in the morning I tried to keep on the lower gravity beers sampling West Berkshire Mr. Chubbs Lunchtime Bitter, North Cotswold Pig Brook and Empire Strikes Back. I finished with a flourish starting with Williams Midnight Sun Porter and Coastal St Pirrans & Erosion (going against Gary the Red Ram's advice). I couldn't visit again until Saturday lunchtime, which was a bit of a waste of time as almost all the interesting beers had gone, which no doubt left the local brewers rubbing their hands. I did
