Beer and Pub News

It is understood that one of Derby's last genuine free houses the **Crompton Tavern** on Crompton Street could be closed by Christmas as the owners have planning permission for change of use to convert the premises in to housing, a sad loss

The freehold is for sale at the **Noah's Ark, Borrowash**

As first mentioned in the July edition of "In the Sticks" the Everards & Derby Brewing collaboration to restore and reopen the **Queens Head** in **Little Eaton** is almost complete, this latest Project William pub is due to reopen on Thursday November 17th with a wide selection of beers from both breweries plus guests

The **Beehive Inn** at **Ripley** is looking to open a Stable Bar at the back of the pub next year

One of Derby's iconic pubs the **Smithfield** on Meadow Road is being put up for sale by owners Terry Evans and Lol Stevenson. It will go under the hammer at Pride Park on December 1st at an auction run by Graham Penny with a guide price of £220,000. Interested parties include Blue Monkey, Trevor Harris of Derby Brewing & Steve Birkin of the Rowditch Inn & Brewery

The **Old Crown** at **Cavendish Bridge** is holding a beer festival 4th to 6th of November

The **Dew Drop Inn** at **Ilkeston** is holding a beer festival with 20 ales from Thursday 17th of November throughout the weekend until the beer is gone. Weather permitting there will also be a hog roast over the weekend

The **Old Kings Head** and the **Devonshire at Belper** have both recently been awarded Cask Marque

The **Red Lion** in **Ripley** is now offering 7 ever-changing guest ales at all times, alongside the **GK/Marston** regulars, making a total of 10 ales, plus normally at least one trad cider. As exclusively revealed in this newsletter last month, the pub is holding a **LocAle Mini-Fest** from 7th to 13th November inclusive, which will showcase up to 20 ales from **Bottle Brook**, **Coppice Side**, **Falstaff**, **Leadmill**, **Middle Earth** and **Thornbridge** amongst others, with card-carrying **CAMRA** members receiving a 50p per pint discount on the festival beers

The **Thorn Tree** at **Belper** recently had a beer, which at first sight looked as if it came from **Howell's Brewery**. Further investigation shows, however, that Mr Howell is a brewer at **Greene King** - another device by the company for not using their own name, without actually telling a lie! (just being economical with the truth - Ed)

The **Bulls Head** at **Belper Lane Ends** is open at last. On sale recently were **Black Sheep** and **Golden Sheep** as well as **Bass**

Del & Rod's Real Ale Rambles

On Sunday 16th we didn't venture very far, parking up on the outskirts of Heanor. We made our way towards Denby, getting a bit lost at Bottom Dumbles and having to bumble to get back on to the path. We eventually came out at Peasehill on the outskirts of **Ripley** where we called in the 2012 **GBG Beehive Inn** to find Theakston XB, Dancing Duck Ay Up and Derby Wishing Well along side several foreign beers and Scrumpy. The Derby brew was sampled and found to be in fine form, well worth the effort to find. From there we walked up the road and round the corner to **Waingroves** and the **Thorn Tree Inn** where we had a choice from Coastal Hop Monster, Backyard Red, Whim Flower Power, Thorn Tree Inn Middle Piddle and a couple of others I can't make out from the picture I took. The Coastal and Backyard were sampled and were most agreeable. It left us both wondering why this pub isn't in the GBG. From there we cut across to Codnor Denby Lane, passing the closed Marquis of Ormonde (I wondered where that pub was), to Codnor Breach (or is it Denby Village) and we even managed a bit of a kip in the sun when we stopped for dinner, I thought those days were behind us already

Harviestoun's Hoptober Fest. On Friday we paid a visit to **Louth**, we had a look around the market where I came across the **Cobble Bar** which had a Real Ale bar opposite the main bar with the beer Barrels on show, 5 beers were on the bar which included; Riggwelter; Crystal Tips from North Yorkshire; Gold IMP from Tom Woods and two seasonal beers from Castle Rock and Bateman's. On the way back to base we called in another Brew Pub- the **Crown at Maltby- le- Marsh**. However, they never had any of their beer on the bar; Pedigree, Bass, Bateman's XXXB, Nobby's Best and Lamp Lighter's Triple from Louth Brewer Fulstow. Apparently Malt B's beer had run out because the Landlord sent a barrel to Louth Beer Festival. Saturday saw us in **Boston** where a proper back street pub, the **Britannia**, was visited serving Bateman's XB and XXXB, which were in excellent form. The landlord had to get to the bar from a side door, which appeared very unusual. We then made a slight detour to **Burgh- le- Marsh**, which is a Mecca for pubs for saying it was a small village. But was disappointed when coming into the GBG pub- the **Red Lion**, the write up in the book was totally different to what we found. Instead of 5 real Ales we found just 2; Hobgoblin and Blacksheep, no need to say anymore. The **Countryman** in **Ingoldmells** was incorporated into the route home. We found a full range of Leila Cottage Ale's, Ace Ale 3.6%, Lacy Days 3.8% Lincolnshire Life 4.2% and Lelia's One Off 5.1%. The one off was in excellent form. The pub was very busy and seemed to be doing very well, though it had a Caravan site at the rear of the pub. This is ideal if you wanted to have a session and crash out in the caravan later - Charisma

On an unseasonably warm Thursday lunchtime, wife and I headed to Ponds Forge Leisure Centre in Sheffield for their Beer Festival. It was only a short walk from the Station but I was well thirsty by the time we got in. The beers were in the international Sports Hall, a huge soulless cavern but infinitely better than last year's mud bath. As usual with Sheffield the beers were better than the venue. Despite the hot weather the temperature inside was just about right but reports suggested that it got a lot warmer later on. Many were sampled with Byatts Phoenix Gold, Devilfish Devils Best and Wentworth Chilli and Chocolate Stout particularly enjoyable. A big downside was the lack of any tasting notes either

in the programme or on the casks. The next day was even hotter so what else to do but head off to the St. Albans Beer Festival. This was my first visit and after a 3 hour journey from door to door we eventually arrived. The layout was a little confusing with the beers spread over three bars but once settled I managed to find some good stuff. Of the many sampled Old Cross Laugh n Titter, Cleveland Black Stuff and Verulam 1470 stood out. We arrived back into Derby and was tempted by the festival at the Brunswick but thought better of it - Trainman

Supporting Local Beer Festivals

A visit to the **Brunswick** beer festival last month was most rewarding with beer choice and beer quality of a high standard. There were 3 new beers from the Brunswick Stable Mysterion 3.9%, Ginger Nuts 4.5% & New Era 5.5% plus ales from Dark Tribe, Blackwater, Toll End, Hopping Mad and a very nice Wild Nettle beer 4.8% from Leatherbritches - Sooty

never made it, such as Arkwright Trouble at Mill, Bowland Admiral of the Blues, Fuzzy Duck Pheasant Plucker and Hopstar Lush. Congrats to Steady Steve and the team for an excellent festival, looking forward to Herefordshire & Worcestershire next year - Ed

The **George & Dragon** in **Belper** held an Oktoberfest From 20th to 22nd of October featuring 20 Ales on gravity out of the barrel, on my visit on the Saturday some of the beers had gone (mainly the strong ones) but there was still plenty to sample. I started with Ashover Cascade 3.5% Followed by Brampton Paula's Passion Ale 4.3% Tring Hook-me-Buck 4.4% & Spire Sovereigns Escort Ale 5%, on the bar there was also a house beer from one of the regions most recent new breweries, Shottle Farm simply called Dragon 4% - Sooty

itself the **Ship**, despite being a trendy bar, served Harvey's Best, Whitstable East India Pale Ale & Old Dairy Gold Top, the latter especially being excellent. Along the narrow street the **Standard** was a traditional locals' pub, a bit short of selection with Directors and Pottons Porter, which was new to me but very strange tasting. Another cycling trip inland took in a call at the **Royal Oak** at **Brooklands**, another trendy place but with decent Woodfordes Wherry, Adnams Bitter and Harvey's Best. Moving across into Kent at **New Romney** we visited yet another trendy all day eating pub, this time the **Ship** with SN Master Brew & Spitfire. On to the windswept gravel covered **Dungeness** coastal peninsula to the **Pilot** for a welcome respite of Harvey's Best with Bombardier, Broadside and the dreaded Courage Best also available. Also on the coast near to the **Dungeness** lighthouses and miniature railway was the Shepherd Neame **Britannia** where the famous fish & chips were partaken along with Master Brew or Spitfire. A truly spectacular location with a remarkable collection of over 2000 keyrings dangling from every orifice. The must have beers in this area were FILO, Old Dairy and another which I discovered on the final evening, Larkins. The location was the **Ypres Castle**, local name 'Wipers' situated halfway uphill between the main road and the church in **Rye**. It was accessible only by about 30 steep steps up or down which proved why there were no other foolish cyclists present. Some good banter within with good beer, the afore mentioned Larkins Best with Harvey's Best, Summer Lightning & TT Landlord also on. I even tried a Bushels Rippendon Kentish Cider before closing the chapter on this holiday with a scary ride back on unlit roads - Chris P Duck

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Can you guess what was the beer festival highlight of October for me?...of course you can, it was the **Royal Oak** at **Ockbrook**. For 12 months this Lancashire festival had been eagerly awaited and the selection didn't disappoint. 18 breweries were represented and 44 beers (and 2 ciders) were on the programme with 26 on the stillage in the Assembly Room and the rest in the cellar to be rotated on the 3 hand pumps on the bar. There were several new breweries to the 2012 GBG such as Blue Buzzard, Burscough, Cross Bay and Worsthorne and others such as Arkwright, Fallon, Lytham and Moonstone that are rarely seen. I made several visits, it would have been rude not to, and in the course of which managed to sample 28 of the beers. My favourites, the darker beers, were few and far between but Mayflower Lancashire Stout, Three B's Stokers Slake, Worsthorne Old Trout and Moonstone Black Star Mild were exceptional (the Moonstone so much so I took it upon myself to drain the tub Sunday lunchtime). The festival was well attended yet again and the weather did it's best. The first beer to go was Moorhouse Pendle Witches Brew (not surprising as it was probably the best known beer at the festival, especially with the Thwaites being in the cellar). All beers were gone off the stillage by 8pm Sunday and in the following days I managed to sample some of the cellar beers that

On 15th - 22nd October I was on holiday in **Rye Harbour**, East Sussex near the Kent border. There 2 local pubs - the **Inkerman Arms** which was more like a restaurant really with Harvey's Best the only beer. The **William The Conqueror** is adjacent to the water and is a Shepherd Neame pub with Master Brew, Bishop's Finger and seasonal Late Red, which was my favourite. Inhabited by an array of strange people it was always entertaining, with life insurance recommended if near to watch the wayward throws of the ladies' darts team who contrived to damage paintwork and furniture whilst aiming at nearest the bull (or more likely the board) for first off. We cycled along the coast to **Pett Level**, visiting the Smugglers with a reasonable if predictable offering of London Pride, Directors, Harvey's Best & Youngs Best. Further along at Hastings the **First In Last Out** justified its GBG status. Known locally as the FILO it had a classic pub interior and own FILO house brews namely Crofters, Ginger Tom & Cardinal as well as St Austell Tribute. The 3 FILO beers were all excellent and a visit is well worthwhile. In the old town part of **Rye**

The opportunity arose for a survey of Shardlow & Cavendish Bridge so I jumped at the chance as it was 2004 when we did it last. I started at the furthest point, the GBG **Old Crown** at **Cavendish Bridge** where I found Jennings Dark Mild, Cumberland & Cocker Hoop, Marston EPA, Old Empire, Pedigree & Wicked Witch and Wychwood Wizard's Staff, a wide selection but Marston stable beers fail to enthuse me. The Wicked Witch was quite acceptable though. Heading back into **Shardlow** I called in the **Restaurant & Bar** at the Marina where there was Pedi, London Pride and Shardlow Reverend Eaton. A bit off the beaten track but the latter was sampled and

found to be in good order, making it worth the effort. I think they keep a Shardlow beer on permanently. From there I headed down to the canal and the **Malt Shovel** where Cumberland and Pedigree were available with the former being none too impressive. The **New Inn** had Directors, Blacksheep Bitter, Bombardier, Pedi and Derby Bobby Dazzler on offer. The latter being a nice drop. Back up to the main road and the **Navigation** was the next port of call where Shardlow Narrow Boat was favoured over Pedi, Hobgoblin and Bateman XB. The **Clock Warehouse** had Pedi,

Cumberland and Brakspear Bitter but I was intrigued at the bar staff who were swapping 2 sparklers between the 3 hand pumps, rinsing it with the soft drinks dispenser in between. Surely they can afford another sparkler! My next stop was Tandoori Nights where I ordered a take-away before nipping over the road to the **Shakespeare Inn** where alongside Pedigree there was Bass, Caledonian 80/- and Robinson's Black Beauty. The latter 2 were sampled and were in good order, especially the 80/-. I collected my

supper and headed back, omitting the recently re- opened **Dog & Duck**, which I'd called in earlier in the week to find Pedi, Hobgoblin, Old Empire and A.N.Other. I didn't think it worthy of a revisit as I'd had my fill of nationals. In summary, from 7 pubs I had a choice of 21 different ales, which could have been great but unfortunately over 2/3's were unexciting national brands with only the Shakespeare, Marina, Navigation & New Inn seeming to be making a concerted effort to provide something different - Catsitter
